

**Examination of Conscience**

We use an examination of conscience to help call to mind our sins and failings during a period of quiet reflection before approaching the priest in Confession. It's important for a good Catholic examination of conscience to be thorough. R.C.I.A. sessions will help you to learn the Catholic faith that you may not be aware of. It's also a chance to *develop* your conscience. This is a critical aid for the beginning Catholic. A Catholic examination of conscience traditionally follows the outline of the *Ten Commandments* and the *Precepts of the Catholic Church*. 
